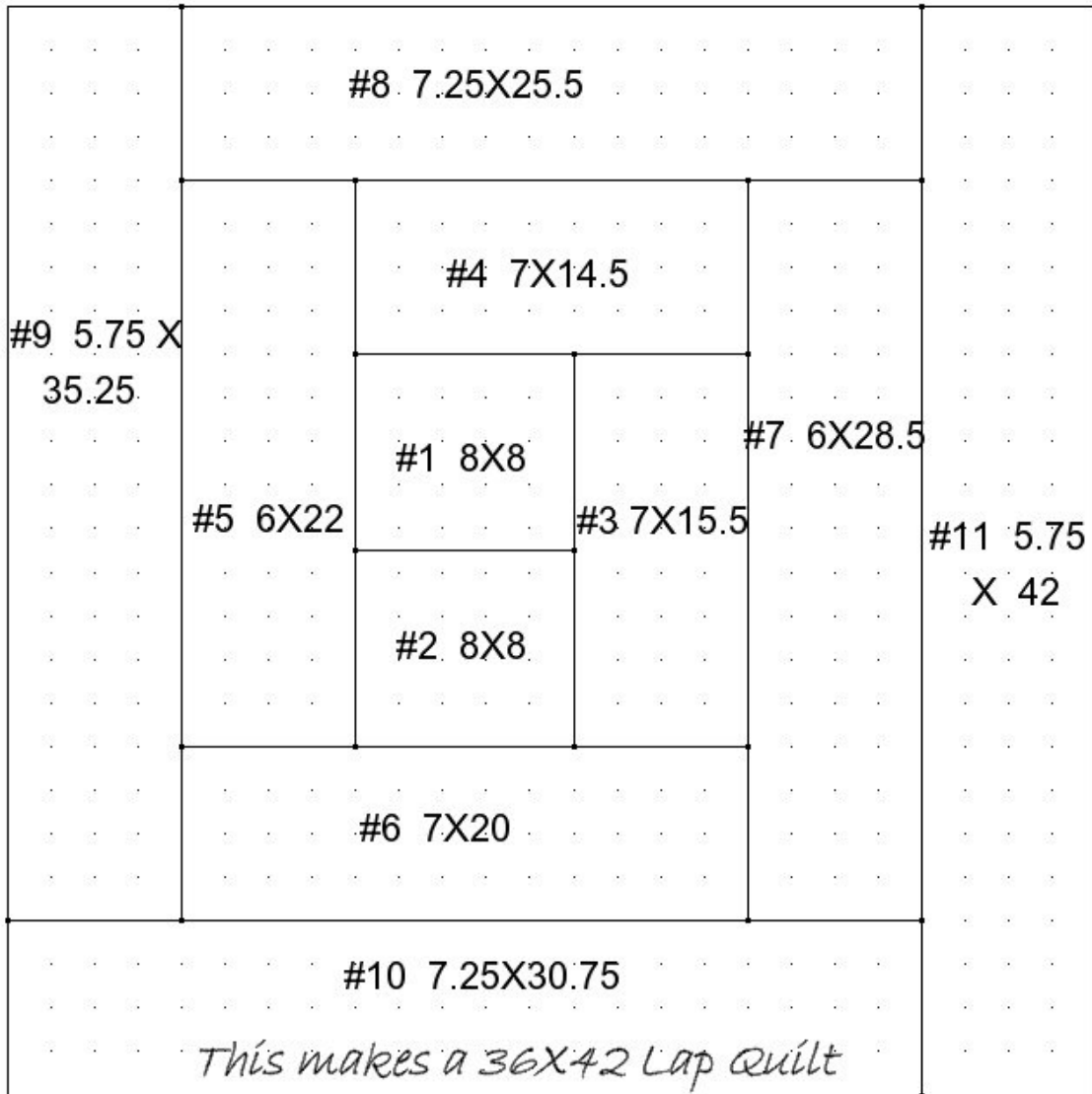


Progressive Quilt As You Go Lap Quilt

A twist on Log Cabin. This special project is a Lap Quilt – ideal for people who are in wheelchairs.

This creates a 36"x42" Lap Quilt.



The measurements above are the CUT sizes of each piece.

Cut all of the 11 pieces by the measurements shown above.

Cut scrappy, or to give the “Log Cabin Look”, choose fabrics in colors as listed below:

- #1 Lightest
 - #4, #5 Lighter
 - #8, #9 Light
 - #2, #3 Dark
 - #6, #7 Darker
 - #10, #11 Darkest
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- Cut Back of Quilt: 38"x44"
 - Cut Batting: 36"x42" (Be sure to measure carefully!)

Instructions

Apply a spray adhesive to the wrong side of the quilt back, being careful not to spray the outside couple of edges. Place the quilt batting on the adhesive and smooth it out, being sure to have 1" of quilt backing showing all around.

Very important to carefully measure to find the placement of piece #1. From the top left corner of your batting, place the raw edge of square #1 in its exact placement. You should have 10.75" of batting showing to the left of #1 and 13.25" of batting showing above #1. Pin #1 in place, right side up.

Place piece #2 in position as shown beside piece #1, flip right sides together, and sew through all layers (piece #2, piece #1, batting, and backing) with a 1/4" seam allowance.

Unfold piece #2 into its finished position with right side up, press, and keep in place with pins or spray adhesive.

Proceed in the same way with pieces #3 through #9, unfolding each piece, pressing it, and keeping it in place as you go.

To finish, fold and press each raw edge over until it touches the batting. Then, fold this pressed edge over onto the front. Topstitch in place. The corners may be finished by stitching a square or by mitering.
